



“Finger Lace” Ring (double-weave)






Material List:

- 12" Trilene, Fireline, or .4 - .5 stretch cord
- Beads: 8/0 seed beads (optional focal bead 6-8mm)

Instructions & notes:

1. center 13 beads on string (if different center, 6-1-6) (figure 1)
 2. add 1 "center bead" & cross threads through (figure 2)
 3. on each side, add 5 "side" beads
 4. add 1 "center" bead & cross threads through
- repeat steps 3 & 4 by singing to yourself:
first the left, then the right, cross thru the middle and pull it tight!
- Continue with this pattern until you get 5 loops (approx. 2 1/4 inches) alternating the count 6 beads, 5 beads, 6 beads, 5 beads...
5. don't cross through the last set of beads (end with 5 each side)
 6. To close the loop, cross through first original center bead with left string (I find it easiest to flip the strand so it's away from me)
 7. Pull tight & tie knot. (I tuck the threads back through a few beads to hide the ends so that I'm not cutting right next to the knot.)
 8. Add a drop of glue or fingernail polish to secure knot & trim threads.

Note: the number of beads may need to be adjusted based on bead size, brand of beads, and desired ring size.

This example makes a ring approx. 6 1/2 - 7 size.
